Workshops

The event incorporates a series of pre-bookable professional development Workshops led and facilitated by expert practitioners.

- ★ **Building information modelling (BIM) - An introduction to BIM Level 2 processes**
In 2016 BIM4Local Government will publish a Client Toolkit for the public sector. This session will: ***Explain how that toolkit will operate. *Try to demystify BIM terms and procedures. * Help to get clients on the road to seeing the benefits of using BIM on their projects.**
- ★ **Getting the best out of Two Stage Open Book**
The LCP framework promotes new forms of procurement including two stage tendering. This session will explain the principles of two stage tendering and how to successfully carry out the process.
- ★ **Employment and Skills - Helping Clients (and contractors) deliver their employment and skill targets through the Client Based Approach.**
The RICS reported in July 2014 that “Skills shortage concerns in the construction industry now stand at their highest level since 2008 according to the latest RICS UK Construction Market Survey (Q2 2014)”. CITB will explain how one of their schemes will help engage apprentices.
- ★ **Tier 2 Engagement Helping to engage with tier 2 and 3 supply chain more effectively using CompeteFor and SCMG**
The key to increased efficiencies in construction is the procurement of an effective supply chain. This session will offer guidance to contractors in the selection and management of supply chain partners.
- ★ **Soft Landings - An introduction to soft landings awareness and benefits for your project**
The change process from construction to occupation needs to be risk free enabling the building to be optimised for operational performance, Mott Macdonald will explain their experience of this process.
- ★ **Integrated Project Insurance**
A discussion on one of the first projects to use the new IPI forms of procurement. Dudley College is a pilot project for the use of this new form of procurement.
- ★ **LCP Major Works User Guide**
The LCP framework comes with templates and a detailed User Guide. This session will briefly outline the key processes and templates and give you the opportunity to ask questions on the call-off processes.
